# Revised Exercises for Chapter 4 of Internet and Web Essentials

#### Your Email

- 1. What is your email address? What is the email address of someone at your site to contact if you have questions or problems?
- 2. What is the name of the SMTP server for your email? Do you use a POP server? What's its Internet address or name?
- 3. Is there a quota or limit on your email? What is it?

### **Using Email**

- 4. Send email to yourself with a reminder about something you need to do in the next few days.
- 5. Read your email. Reply to at least one message. Delete two messages and forward one message.
- 6. Send a message, using multiple addresses, to at least three other people.
- 7. Using your email program, save a message to a folder and print the same message.
- 8. Create a signature for yourself and test it by sending yourself a short message.
- 9. Do the following:
  - a. Find a picture of Salvador Dali on the Internet and send it as an attachment to an email message.
  - b. Find an image of a piece of work by Salvador Dali on the Internet and send it as an attachment to an email message.
- 10. Learn how to create a filter or rule for your email system. For each of the parts below, send yourself a message with the subject "testing filters" to demonstrate that you've completed the exercise.
  - a. Create a filter or rule that automatically puts all email with the subject "testing filters" in the Deleted Items or Trash folder.

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b. Create a folder named testing and create a filter or rule that automatically puts all incoming messages with the subject "testing filters" in the folder named testing.
